


MEXICO ISN'T PAYING FOR THE WALL....

Republicans are abandoning their constituents and military service members by allowing critical funding for military construction projects—including schools and daycares—to be taken away so that President Trump can fund his border wall.

BY THE NUMBERS

\$3.6 BILLION The amount of money canceled from military construction projects across the United States and around the world.

- **26** The number of states and territories that will be hurt by this decision.
- **127** The number of military construction projects on the Administration's hit list.

\$63 MILLION The amount of money Mitch McConnell is allowing to be canceled from the construction of Fort Campbell Middle School in Kentucky, a new school for 552 students, in order to build less than 3 miles of border wall.

\$558 MILLION The total amount of money the Administration is taking away from schools in the U.S. and in other countries, hurting the children and students of military families.

In March, <u>41 Republican Senators voted</u> with the President, agreeing with him that the border wall was more important than their own home states and our service members.

Trump Cuts \$17 Million Project At Florida Air Force Base To Pay For Border Wall. "When President Donald Trump visited Tyndall Air Force Base in May, he promised it would be rebuilt "better than ever" after Hurricane Michael caused catastrophic damage. Four months later, the Department of Defense announced that a \$17 million project to build a fire-rescue station at the base near Panama City will be put on hold to pay for portions of a wall at the U.S.-Mexico border, one of Trump's signature campaign promises." Funds Meant For Aging Fire Station At SC Military Base Shifted To Trump's Border Wall. "President Donald Trump's order to reallocate funds from defense projects to fund his U.S.-Mexico border wall has drained money meant to replace a fire station at a South Carolina military base. The \$11 million allocation had been designated for new fire station at the Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort. Pentagon officials said last year that not replacing it could be a safety hazard for military families if not addressed." [The Post and Courier, September 10]

No New School at Fort Campbell: The Money Went to Trump's Border Wall. "For almost two decades, families at Fort Campbell, the sprawling Army base along the KentuckyTennessee border, have borne the brunt of the country's war efforts as a steady clip of troops with the 101st Airborne Division and from Special Operations units deployed to Afghanistan and Iraq. This week, the families discovered that they would not get the new middle school they were expecting so that President Trump could build his border wall. [New York. <u>Times, September 5</u>]

Senator Tillis allows Funds for N.C. School and Medical Center to be Raided for Border Wall. "The affected projects in North Carolina include \$40 million for a new battalion complex and ambulatory care center at Camp Lejeune, a previously canceled \$32.9 million elementary school at Fort Bragg, and a \$6.4 million storage facility for the new KC-46 tanker at Seymour Johnson Air Force Base."
